Inauguration of the art exhibition «Myrtis»

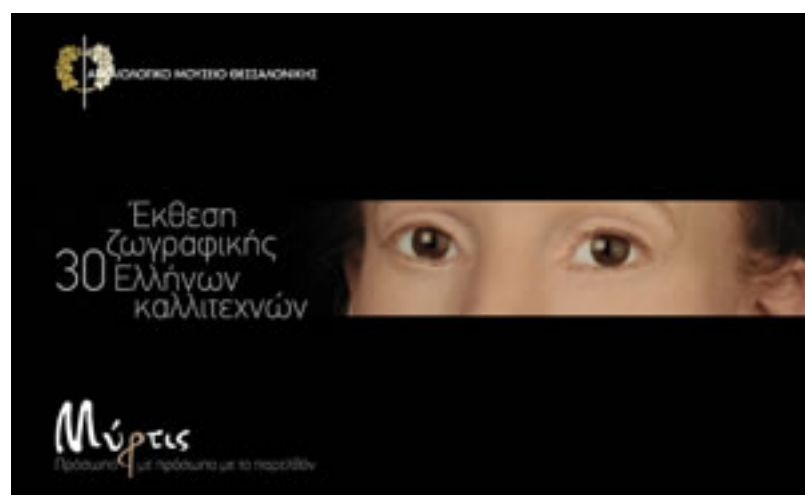
Friday, February 11th at the Archaeological Museum of Thessaloniki
