
**Myrtis: Face to face with the past –  
under the auspices of the Royal Norwegian Embassy in Athens**

This Embassy has had the pleasure of working with Dr. Manolis Papagrigorakis for several years. Dr. Manolis Papagrigorakis took his post graduate program at the department of Orthodontics, University of Bergen, where his Master thesis was on the cranio-facial complex of Ancient Greeks.

Since 2010 the exhibition "Myrtis: Face to face with the past", a project undertaken by the University of Athens, has travelled throughout Greece. The exhibition presents the course followed for the examination and work on the skeletal material found at the ancient cemetery of Kerameikos, ending with the reconstruction of the face of an 11 year old victim of the plague.

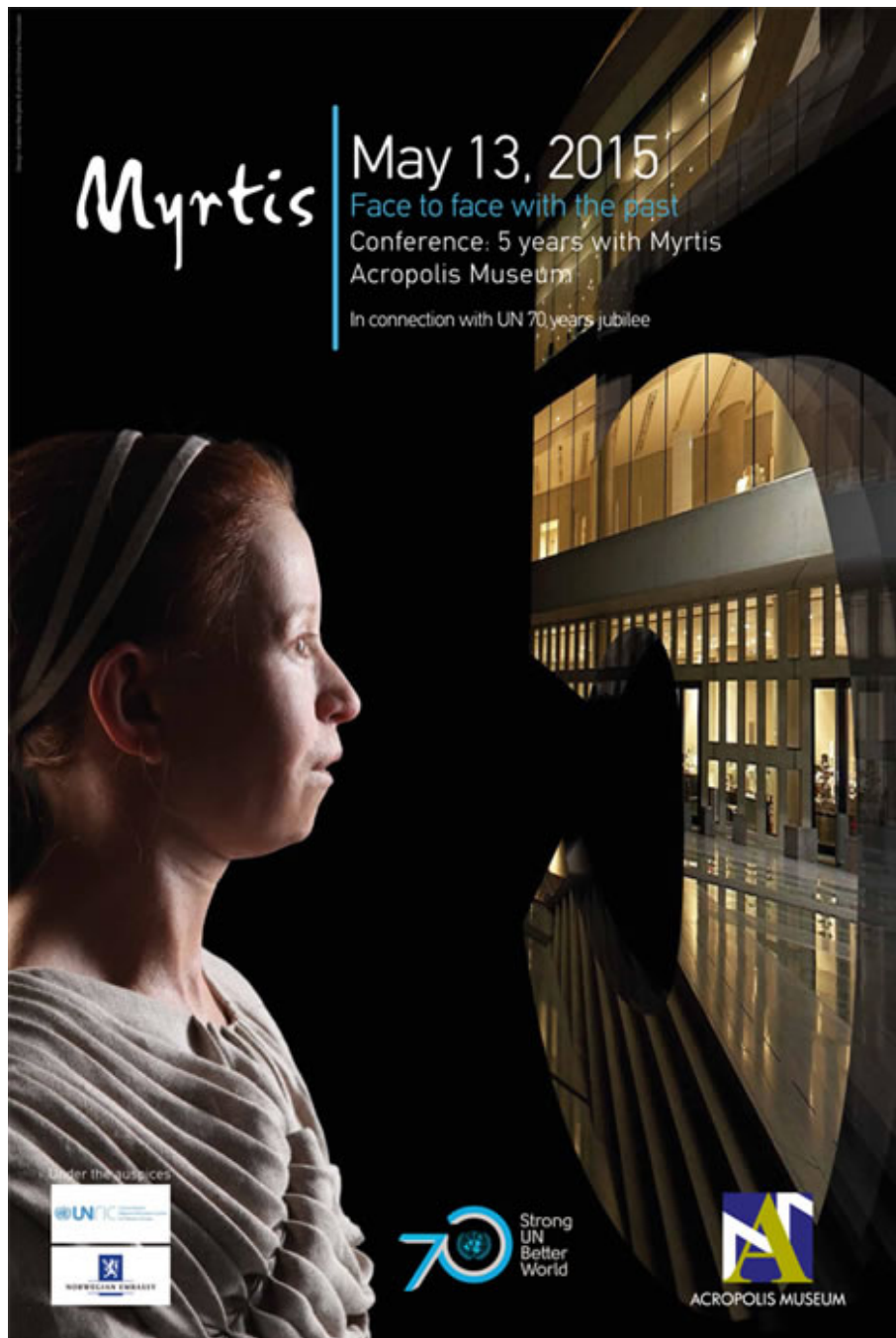
Celebrating its 5<sup>th</sup> year, the project will be the subject of a conference at the Acropolis Museum of Athens.


